High Tension Kevlar Top Heads

Andante Core-tec Elite is the most popular drumhead on the market right now, taking over from the Remo Cybermax which previously held the top spot.

The head works on all modern drums including Andante, Premier, Pearl and the British Drum Company's Axial.





The Andante Core-tec Original is the predecessor to the Elite head and some drummers still consider its sound to be superior, especially for indoor playing. It does not protect from water quite as well as the Elite but can produce a very pure sound which works well on some drums.

Evans Pipe Band Series Kevlar Heads are black in colour and come in two slightly different sizes.

PB-SB1A is designed to fit oversized 14" Pipe Band snare drums (Premier).

PB-SB1B is designed to fit standard 14" Pipe Band snare drums (Andante, Pearl etc.).

The head is typically very stable at high tension and produces a distinct sound and look that some drummers prefer.



Bottom Heads for Snare Drums

The Remo AM Hazy is the most popular bottom snare head on the market. It works well for all popular high tension snare drums.

The head is a 1-ply 3-mil thickness with a hazy, not clear finish.

It comes up to pitch quickly and allows the bottom snares on most drums to be set almost immediately.





The Aquarian Classic Clear Snare is a popular alternative to the AM Hazy above. It's also a single ply 3-mil head with Aquarian's no pull Safet-Lok hoop design.

The head takes a little longer to come up to pitch but tends to stay at top tension for longer.




The Evans SS300 is another contender for excellent bottom snare response with a slightly 'punchier' tone than the others. It features a 3-mil single ply also with Evans 360 Technology for quick and easy tuning.







How often should you change snares?

Most bands will change snare wires once or twice a year. The constant movement and stretching of the snare means it will wear out over time and become more of a tired elastic band sound than a shiny 'crack'. The snare wires as they get tired will also start to rattle endlessly which results in more tension being applied to the point where the drum starts to sound choked and dull.

When you change snares, it's also best to change heads and clean your drum. Budgeting for yearly heads and snares will keep your drum in top condition for many years.

Bass & Tenor Heads

The REMO Powermax Ultra White Pipe Band Tenor and Bass head is a single ply 10-mil head with an internal freefloating muffle ring for added tone control.

It can be used on the top or on both the top and bottom of tenor drums depending on the drum and tone required.

They come in a variety of sizes as listed in the chart.

often should you nge B&T Heads?

Yearly is best. Changing heads allows you to inspect the drum for damage, clean the drum and grease any moving parts.

Drums that stay under tension with old heads for many years tend to warp and become difficult to tune. This is especially true for wood-hoop tenor drums. Drums can last for many many years but only if they're looked after well.

The familiar ribbed pattern, has given way to a smoother and sturdier design. The M&G Attack still offers the snare stick style handle which is most comfortable for those players coming from a snare drum background or with smaller hands.

The sound difference is a slight mid range bump with the Attack model for a better defined stroke, while the Original model maintains its smooth and round sound that's been its hallmark for many years.

This 5mm drum key works on all Andante snare, tenor and bass drums.

Evans Bit Key



The Evans Bit Key is designed to fit inside the chuck of most standard power drills allowing you to loosen and tighten bolts with square heads quickly. The bit must be used with caution as over-tensioning and resulting head breaks can happen almost immediately with high-powered electric and battery drills. We suggest drills with internal brakes so that the bit stops turning immediately once you release the trigger.

If you're working on a whole corps of drums at once, then this drill bit can really help speed the workflow up. If you're new to changing heads and tuning drums, then we suggest you start with the good old-fashioned hand key as pictured above.




The Hugh Cameron Shim Pack contains various thicknesses of brass material designed to help shim your top snare. A set of scissors able to cut the brass into thin strips is included.

Top snare shimming was a process developed by Hugh Cameron to precisely 'tune' the top snare for maximum response.

If you've ever been to a Hugh Cameron tuning workshop then you'll know exactly what these are for.

The Precision Drum Dial is a tympanic measuring device used to tune tenor and bass drum heads. It's a simple device that measures the tension at each tuning point around the drum. You can use it to quickly set a starting tension for your drum heads, then fine tune by ear and an electronic tuner after that.

The Vic Firth Bag

The Vic Firth Bag holds an extra pairs of snare drum sticks in a tough nylon bag designed to velcro around the posts on your snare drum.




84321 Exercise by Doug Stronach

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

Strathspey and Reel - massed band style

If there's such a thing as a massed band strathspey and reel score for drummers then these might be it. I learned a version of these scores as a young drummer in Scotland many years ago and they have consistently showed up time and time again in many tattoos and group performances where more than one band was in attendance. Highland dancers are often added to the spectical at these group events and they like them played fast. A nice simple drum score is the key to speed and clarity for any multi-band performance. Although the standard tune names are given, these scores will work for a variety of lighter 2 parted strathspey and reel melodies and at tempos slower or faster than those suggested. Slings and Stands





The brand new Hosbilt Gemini Sling is a double waist sling designed to allow complete arm and shoulder freedom to flourish and play while still carrying the drum.

The Hosbilt Deluxe and Hosbilt Plain tenor and snare drum sling offers an over the shoulder traditional sling option. The Deluxe version adds an additional waistbelt (pictured) to help support the drum better.



Gibralter Basket Snare Drum and Pad Stand



The short version extends from 18" to 25" (plus height of the drum or pad) while the tall version has a range of 26" to 40" (plus the height of the drum or pad). Using it with a drum at maximum extension is not recommended and the tri-pod legs should be on a flat surface and in a position to avoid the drum from falling over at any point.







KP AIRlift Stands





The Jim Kilpatrick AIRlift series of snare, tenor and bass stands allows the player complete control of height and angle adjustment in a light and easy to carry aluminum design. The snare version is mounted using the Kilpatrick Snare Carrier Mounting bracket (not included), while the tenor stand allows the drum's carry hook to clip into place on the top of the stand.



The Kilpatrick AIRlift Tenor Stand has the same tripod leg design as the snare version, but with a top piece (pictured) that allows the carry hook to slip into.







Hercules Bass Stand






Books

The Ontario Massed Band Scores were first introduced by Hugh Cameron in 1974. Since then, they've become the standard four scores played by bands all over North America.





Any and all aspiring drummers or composers can't overlook these books. They are a must-have for all pipe band drummers.





The Full Score and Other Musings by Doug Stronach

Long gone are the days when writing just the snare drum score would satisfy the main rhythm accompaninemt needed for a full drum corps sound. The bass and tenor have become an integral addition to the sound of a drum corps with their parts not only being composed and notated on paper, but the drums tuned and then voiced to different pitches across the tenor and bass line.

The notation opposite is an example of what's called a Full Score, where the bass and tenor parts are written and notated along with the snare line. It's a great way for new composers to start writing bass and tenor parts, and also a great way for the bass, tenor and snare drummers to visually see how all the parts interact with one other. This score would still be considered incomplete however, as voicing and flourishing has yet to be added to this framework of basic rhythms.

Although it may best for only one composer to write all of the snare, bass and tenor parts to achieve one single rhythmic focus (a point that can be often argued in bands), it would still need the specialised input of bass and tenor drummers to decide the flourishing and voicing of the different rhythms.

The idea of presenting a score like this is not new but it has struggled to become common place, perhaps due to the fact that most scores are still hand-written and the time it takes to notate clean copies by hand is considerable. However, times are changing and notation software is getting much easier to handle. Personally, I'd never write out a full score by hand, but inside a computer it's relatively easy-going once you master the basic work flow of the software. This multi-line format in software form is also very easy to break out into the individual parts that the snare, bass and tenor drummers can then work from.

The Full Score is also known as the Conductor's Score and gives an overview of the entire ensemble, especially when the pipe tune is added to it. This is how the Full Score is presented in the RSPBA Tutor Books from many years ago. A conductor in pipe bands is not something that's been generally accepted of course, but to me is an obvious next step towards better band ensemble.

Similar to the Full Score, the idea of a conductor in pipe bands is again not something new. Famed Dysart and Dundonald Pipe Major Robert Shepherd was doing it way back in the 1970s and 80s along with the semi-circle concert formation idea. It has to be noted also that the Bagad bands in Brittany France have been doing both the conductor and concert formation very successfully for many years.

Both ideas are a step in the right direction as far as I'm concerned but still many years later struggling to take hold in traditional pipe bands. Change can be frustratingly slow in the pipe band world with our many rules and regulations that make competition fairer for everyone, but are always at the same time in danger of stifling the development and future of our art form.

Snare drummers will note that there is no dot and cut sixteenth notes notated in their part. This is a score written 'round' as in all notes even but with a slight swing feel as noted in text above the first bar.

It doesn't really matter to me whether the dot and cut sixteenth note is written or not (i've done it both ways). Good drummers will find the right amount of swing in these notes to make the rhythms work and by taking the dot and cut out of the sixteenth notes, it might just suggest better that ALL notes sound best with some element of swing rhythm added to them. This in my experience, is more accurate to how we actually play.
